Activity

Looking for Lyrics

What You Need:

Paper, writing utensil

What You Do:

Copy down the following song titles on a separate sheet of paper:

"Count on Me" by Bruno Mars

- "Happy" by Pharrell Williams
- "A Whole New World" from Aladdin
- "Something Just Like This" by Coldplay
- "We Don't Talk About Bruno" from Encanto

Say to your child, "I'll read off a lyric to a song. You'll look at the list of song titles and choose which title you think the lyric comes from. Ready?"

- A new fantastic point of view. No one to tell us, "No," or where to go, or say we're only dreaming. (Answer: "A Whole New World" from Aladdin)
- It might seem crazy what I'm 'bout to say. Sunshine, she's here, you can take a break. (Answer: "Happy" by Pharrell Williams)
- If you tossin' and you're turnin' and you just can't fall asleep, I'll sing a song beside you.

 (Answer: "Count on Me" by Bruno Mars)
- ► He told me that the life of my dreams would be promised, and someday be mine. (Answer: "We Don't Talk About Bruno" from Encanto)
- ► How much you want to risk? I'm not looking for somebody with some superhuman gifts.

 (Answer: "Something Just Like This" by Coldplay)

When you're finished, say, "You did a great job choosing the right title for each of set of lyrics! Today, we heard why it's so important to choose carefully when it comes to our friends."

Talk About the Bible Story

Why are friendships important?

Think about the closest friends you have. What makes each of them a good friend to you?

Why do you think they've chosen to be friends with you?

Is it difficult to choose friends carefully?

Parent: Talk about how one of your friends encourages you to be more like Jesus. They may encourage you with Bible verses, set an example of doing what Jesus would do, or pray with you. Go beyond generalities and tell your child about a specific example.

Use this prayer as a guide, either after talking about the Bible story or sometime before bed tonight:
